PROCLAMATION

Memorializing those impacted by and lost to the COVID-19 virus

- WHEREAS, The first Monday in March is an appropriate day to be recognized as COVID-19 Victims and Survivors Memorial Day; and
- WHEREAS, COVID-19, a novel coronavirus, is a deadly illness caused by a virus that can transmit from person to person; and
- WHEREAS, In 2020, COVID-19 began to spread throughout the world, creating a global pandemic that has had a catastrophic impact on human life, our communities, and our economy; and
- WHEREAS, In March 2020, communities in every State began to experience increased loss of life, and families lost fathers, mothers, brothers, sisters, sons, daughters, and neighbors from the virus; and
- WHEREAS, Beginning in 2020, many across the United States were and continue to be personally impacted by COVID- 19 including mourning their loved ones and neighbors or suffering from the unknown long-term health implications of the virus; and
- WHEREAS, By the end of February 2021, more than 500,000 people in the United States tragically lost their lives; and
- WHEREAS, Public servants, frontline and essential workers, and health care professionals took selfless actions to protect their neighbors and communities, support struggling local economies, and find innovative ways to provide services; and
- WHEREAS, Each life lost to COVID-19 and each sacrifice made shall never be forgotten.

NOW THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Garden Grove, California does hereby proclaim the first Monday in March as COVID -19 Victims and Survivors Memorial Day in Garden Grove.
