MATTERS FROM THE MAYOR, CITY COUNCIL MEMBERS, AND CITY MANAGER

CORONAVIRUS EMERGENCY OPERATION COMMAND UPDATE PRESENTED BY CITY MANAGER STILES INCLUDING: JOBS FIRST PROGRAM AND EXPANDING OUTDOOR DINING FOR LOCAL RESTAURANTS UPDATE BY ASSISTANT CITY MANAGER, LISA KIM; CITY COUNCIL REVIEW AND CONFIRMATION OF A TEMPORARY OUTDOOR DINING PERMIT FOR RESTAURANTS; FISCAL YEARS 2019-20 AND 2020-21 FINANCIAL UPDATE BY FINANCE DIRECTOR, PATRICIA SONG (F: 117.2A)

City Manager Stiles reviewed the current information and status related to the COVID-19 crisis, noting that the State approved the Orange County reopening plan on Saturday, May 23, 2020, for moving into Stage 2 and encouraged the public to visit the Orange County Health Care Agency website for guidance. Executive Order No. 3 was signed on May 21, 2020, for a temporary outdoor dining permit at the discretion of the City's Economic and Community Development Department, of which the City Council is being asked to ratify. Information was provided by the State for the upcoming Stage 3 with new guidance for reopening barber shops and hair salons that will be posted on the State's website and also the City's website. There has been discussion by the State on reopening theme parks soon, and any new information and guidelines will be provided on churches and places of worship. Suspension of street sweeping citations, water shut off penalties are still in place and as we move into Stage 2 and Stage 3 the public will receive advance notification when the suspension ends. City Council meetings will resume in person in June and will be held in the A and B Rooms in the Community Meeting Center and will be televised and live streamed.

Assistant City Manager, Lisa Kim, provided background information on the newly launched Jobs 1st Program for zero percent interest business loans for the creation of new jobs, and grants for the retention of jobs at risk of being lost. The Program will be available until the funds have been exhausted and the application and program guidelines are available on the City's website. An additional program for restaurants is an Accessible Dining Program to expand outdoor dining to assist local restaurants with reopening their businesses to meet social distancing requirements and is a sixty day outdoor dining permit.

Following City Attorney Sandoval's report it was moved by Council Member Brietigam, seconded by Council Member Klopfenstein that:

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The Third Executive Order of the Director of Emergency Services be confirmed and approved to temporarily suspend the limitations of the Municipal Code relating to outdoor dining.

Finance Director, Patricia Song provided a PowerPoint presentation reviewing the financial impacts to the City caused by the COVID-19 crisis.

MATTERS FROM THE MAYOR, CITY COUNCIL MEMBERS, AND CITY MANAGER (Continued)

Council Member Brietigam recognized and thanked Garden Grove resident Laura Herzog for honoring our fallen, holding the event from her home when it is normally held in Long Beach; and he thanked all those who attended.

Mayor Pro Tem O'Neill stated that he misses Memorial Day festivities and hopes that people were able to spend time with their families. He asked that everyone use common sense and wear a mask in public, and he wished everyone well.

Council Member Deidre Nguyen commented that as we moved into Stage 2 for reopening, wearing a mask is critical to protect the health of everyone. She stated that 35 percent of the people who test positive for COVID-19 are asymptomatic. She cautioned that the severity of the virus affects people differently and can lead to death. She highly recommended that everyone wear a mask in public to protect themselves and their families.

Council Member Kim Nguyen echoed the concern, asking everyone to wear a mask out in public and to adhere to any signage requiring a mask in businesses to protect yourself and employees. She noted that we are at a 74 percent response rate in Garden Grove for the 2020 Census, and she asked those who have not responded to do so to ensure tax dollars are provided to our community.

City Attorney Sandoval announced no reportable action was taken during closed session.
